'RECYCLE' your greeting cards & tins this Christmas

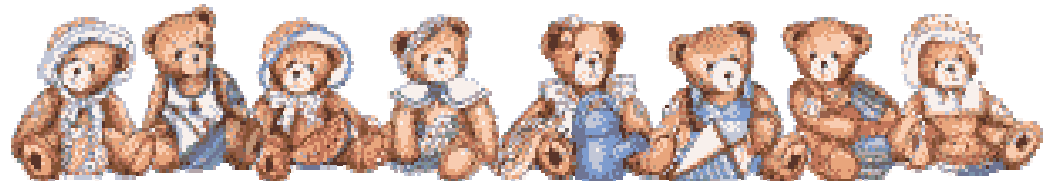

'Cross stitch Christmas cards are a 'specialty' card for 'special people'. The embroidery is by disadvantaged girls at St Josephs Orphanage (run by the Sisters of Charity). The quality of the work is of a high standard and the cards are assembled in Australia. They sell for \$15 for a pack of 2 cards. All profits go to the education fund at St Josephs Orphanage. There are 130 girls residing at the Home and are dependent on donors to feed and school the children.
